Course description

This two-hour course has a double objective: on the one hand, this course aims to allow students to consolidate their knowledge of English grammar, and on the other hand, it is an introduction to the techniques of translation into French and English.

In grammar, in the first semester, we will deal with questions related to the translation of grammatical tenses and aspects, while in the second semester the exercises will focus more on the construction of verbs (intransitive verbs, verbs with complements, verbs followed by subordinates).

As far as the translation part is concerned, we will propose themes and versions, either translated or adapted, of press extracts on various subjects: societal, political, commercial or cultural. These translation topics will be distributed in class in the form of handouts.
