Course description

This course serves to develop students' English grammar and communication skills in order to facilitate successful university study.

A thorough review of English grammar will be covered and some of the grammatical points examined will be: a review of tenses, modality, reported speech, phrasal verbs, relative clauses. (This list is not exhaustive.)

At the end of this course, students are expected to be able to:

- 1- identify and analyse the functions of grammatical categories in English (speech and sentence elements, sentence structures and clause combinations);
- 2- develop a critical approach to grammatical competence in academic writing and develop the ability to formulate concise, correct and well-structured English sentences
- 3- apply knowledge of English grammar in writing by recognising and correcting grammatical and punctuation errors.
