English Speaking in Interaction (Bachelor Year 2 / Spring)



Bachelor in Applied Foreign Languages (English) / Faculty of Liberal Arts

Introduction

The course is based on press reviews and presentations by the students, followed by debates, with students given the opportunity to explore topics relating to their own interests.

The course aims to develop students' spoken skills in relation to current affairs and topics in the news, to enable them to take part in nuanced discussion using appropriate language, and to demonstrate an understanding of context and perspective in news reporting.
