

Understanding the Press (Bachelor Year 2 / Fall)

Bachelor in Applied Foreign Languages (English) / Faculty of Liberal Arts

Introduction

The course centers on the reading and analysis of authentic English language documents destined for a highly educated adult audience (The Atlantic, The Economist). The students make a presentation about a news topic of their choice in English and write an in-class essay. Topics include China-Taiwan tensions, the conflicts in the Middle East, and the genocide in Tigray.

Objectives

The students are taught to read high-level English language articles, put them in context and improve their knowledge of general culture.
To encourage students to engage in thoughtful discourse and debate on media-related issues.
